FEDERAL JUDICIAL

Judicial Review, Judicial Supremacy, Judicial Power

"Province and duty of judicial department to say what the law is." -Marshall

"Ultimate interpreter of the Constitution" -Cooper v...

Obligation of coordinate officials not only to obey the (judicial) ruling but to follow its reasoning in future deliberations

Judicial Supremacy is "essential to American Constitutionalism",
"essential to preserving the Rule of Law".
"essential to preventing constitutional anarchy"

There must be one supreme interpreter of the constitution. Supreme judicial power is uniquely qualified

Serves as a 'forum of principle' within the American institutional system, capable of focusing on 'questions of justice' free from the din of "the battleground of power politics"
